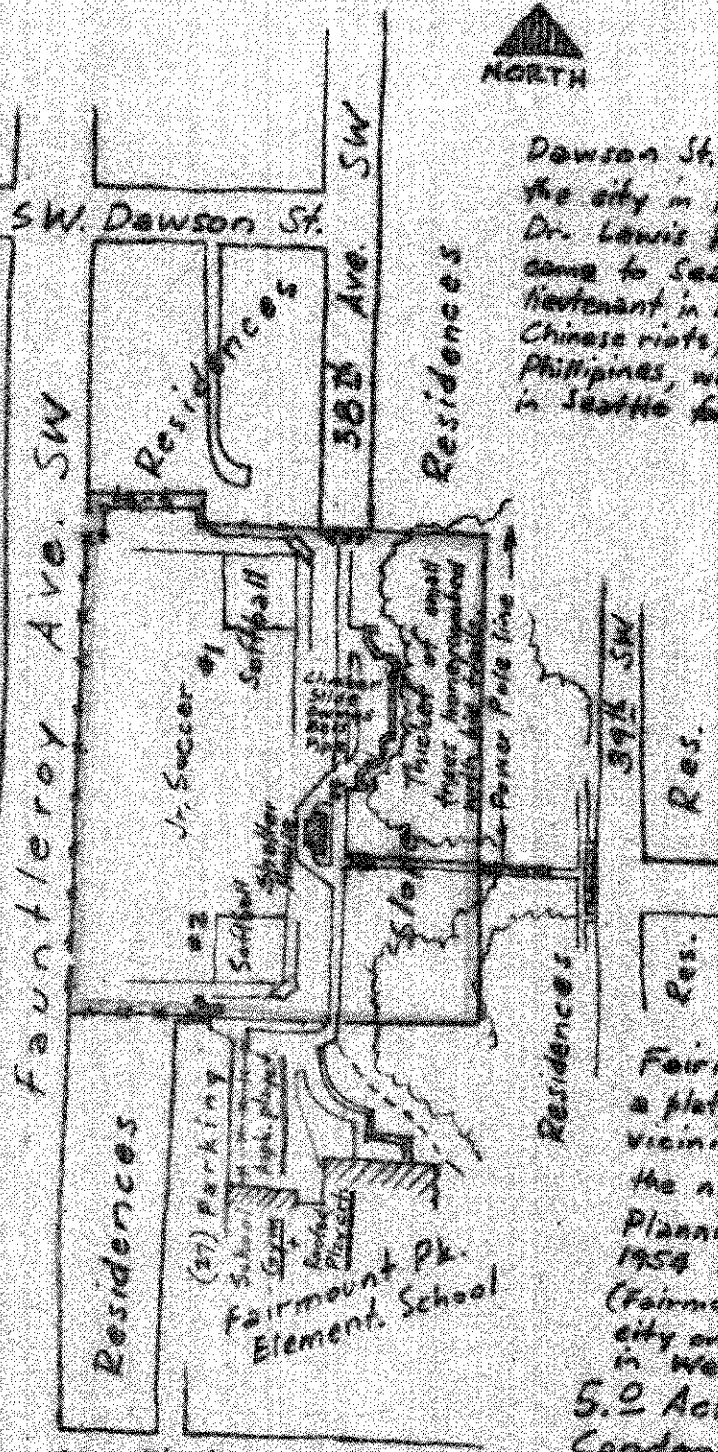


Fauntleroy Ave. follows the route of the early day traction line from Seattle to the Fauntleroy District, which was named after a cave on Puget Sound by Lt. George Davidson to honor the family name of his bride-to-be, Elliner Fauntleroy.



Dawson St. named either for the city in Alaska or for Dr. Lewis R. Dawson who came to Seattle in 1880's: lieutenant in Navy Guard during Chinese riots, army surgeon in Philippines, well known pediatrician in Seattle for two generations.

SW. Brandon St.



Fairmount is the name of a plat filed 1907 (S.P. 1100) in the vicinity; a name applied to the neighborhood by the Planning Commission in the 1954 Recreation Report. (Fairmount is the name of a city on the Monongahela River in West Virginia; also a 'model' park in Philadelphia 1800s)
