Name given prior to annexation.
Nearby waterway named Salmon Bay - site of Indian Charlie's House on south shore near mouth of Bay. Salmon Bay named by William Bell and the Denny brothers who discovered it in 1852, because of the great number of salmon they found in the area. (Prior to dredging the Ship Canal, Bay was a tidal flat.) (Indian camp on bay was "Cilcole" or "Shilshole".) [The game fish has its name origin in the Latin word "Salmonis" from the Latin verb "salire" - "to leap, dance"]
