



Potholing for 23rd Ave E Vision Zero this weekend!

Starting as soon as November 30, we will be conducting potholing work (a method of excavating underground) to ensure the locations of new proposed signal pole will not damage existing underground utilities and/or structures. This work is associated with the 23rd Ave E Vision Zero Project.

Dates: Saturday, November 30 through Sunday, December 1

Work hours: 8 AM – 5 PM

Locations: Intersections of 24th Ave E/E Lynn St and 23rd Ave E/E John St

WHAT TO EXPECT

We will minimize construction impacts as much as possible. During construction, please expect:

- Weekend work hours of 8 AM – 5 PM
- Intermittent travel lane shifts and pedestrian detour during work hours. Please follow detour signs.

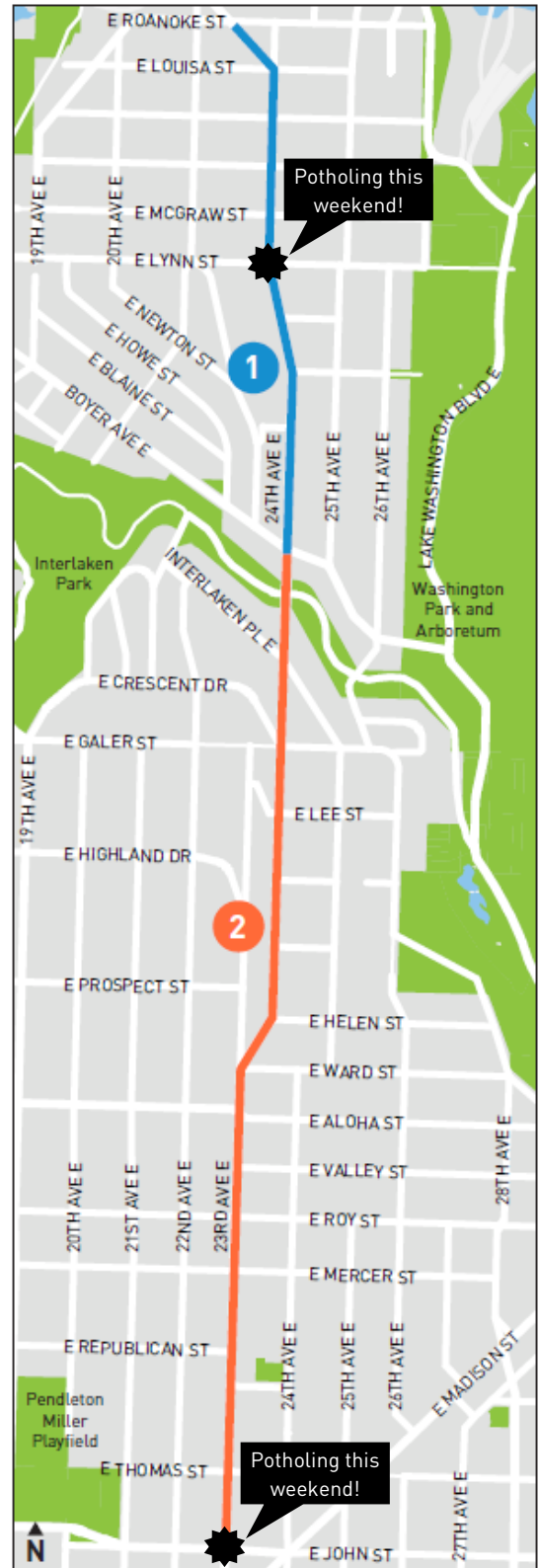
PROJECT OVERVIEW

We're enhancing safety and mobility on 23rd Ave E/24th Ave E between E John St and E Roanoke St as part of our Vision Zero efforts to reach zero traffic deaths and serious injuries by 2030. Segment 1 was completed in 2018 and Segment 2 will go into construction in 2020.
